A. Summary of changes

Local and Regional Projects and Programs

APA 3 included language allowing an increase in funding for Round 1 and 2 projects, up to 20%, to cover cost increases caused by inflation. It also mentioned that more funding would be available for Low-To-Moderate Income (LMI) projects in Round 1 and DSP projects that were previously awarded due to inflation.

To clarify, additional funding is not limited to only LMI projects for Round 1 and DSP projects previously awarded. LOCD-DR will make sure all projects meet the CDBG-MIT grant requirements. This includes spending at least 50% of funds to benefit Low-To-Moderate Income (LMI) households, at least 50% on projects that help the Most Impacted and Distressed parishes, and meeting the period of performance.

This explanation does not change the maximum amount of \$20,000,000 for all projects in rounds 1 and 2 or the total funding levels updated in APA 3.

According to the state's Master Action Plan, Section IX(F), this APA is considered non-substantial because it doesn't add a CDBG-MIT Covered Project, change the benefit or eligibility rules, add or remove an activity, move more than \$25 million, or make a change that affects more than 25% of a program's budget.
