## LOUISIANA INITIATIVE FOR SMALL ENTREPRENEURSHIPS (THE HUDSON INITIATIVE)

## 2021 - 2022 FISCAL YEAR STATUS

For the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, the total reported state expenditures with certified Hudson Initiative small entrepreneurships was \$90,556,626.56. At the end of the June 30, 2022 fiscal year period, LED reported two thousand two hundred and eight-five (2,285) certified Hudson Initiative small entrepreneurships. Of this number, a total of one thousand eight hundred and eighteen (1,818) were registered in LaGov.

For the previous fiscal year (July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021), the total reported expenditure on contracts was \$70,772,748.50. The table below is an overview of expenditures to Hudson Initiative small entrepreneurships for fiscal years July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 and July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. The DOA and state agencies in concert with LED are continuing our efforts to inform businesses about the program and to encourage their certification. The DOA is also encouraging state agencies to maximize their efforts in contracting with small entrepreneurships.

## ADDITIONAL INITIATIVE REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED BY STATUTE

A. La. R.S. 39:2007(C) requires the Commissioner of Administration to provide periodic training for relevant state employees to acquaint them with the requirements of the initiative and administrative law related thereto.

**B.** La. R.S. 39:2007(D) requires the Commissioner of Administration to conduct a training program at least semiannually to acquaint small entrepreneurships with state procurement and public contract proposal and bidding practices.

On behalf of the Commissioner, the Office of State Procurement conducts outreach activities to acquaint small entrepreneurships with state contracting and procurement, to encourage certification and to encourage small entrepreneurships to enroll in the state's electronic vendor notification system, LaGov.
