Prevention & Primary Care — CAHSD Prevention program provides a variety of substance abuse prevention programs and outreach services for persons below the age of 18; its Primary Care program integrates behavioral and primary health care needs through providing physical health screens and referral to primary care providers from within its mental health and addictive disorders outpatient clinics and by contracting with private primary health care providers for physical health screening and treatment of clients while in its residential treatment facility and operation of a physical healthcare clinic inside its largest adult behavioral health outpatient facility which is open to all of its clients.

This highly specialized program focuses on connecting the severely mentally ill individual with primary care providers to eliminate and/or improve chronic illnesses, to educate them on the importance of good overall health care (behavioral and physical) and to increase the life expectancy of the individuals receiving services in our public behavioral health clinics.

SGF funding is needed after the Year 4 federal funding for CAHSD's SAMHSA Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC)- Planning, Development, and Implementation (PDI) Grant # H79SM086816 ends on 9/29/2026, since the State of Louisiana may not be ready by that date to fund CCBHC services via the Louisiana Medicaid State Plan. The SGF funding would serve as gap funding until LDH OBH and LDH Medicaid are able to fully implement the Louisiana Medicaid CCBHC program that is currently in the planning stage. While there is no current federal/ state mandate that requires this funding, CCBHC outpatient services are a SAMHSA-endorsed evidence based practice and have been shown to reduce costlier emergency department and inpatient hospital services for the population served by CCBHCs including adults with serious mental illness, children with serious emotional/ behavioral disorders, and individuals with co-occurring substance use disorders. This budget combines programs which manage community-based mental health, additive disorders and developmental disabilities services for children and their families who resides in the parishes of Ascension, East and West Baton Rouge, East and West Feliciana, Iberville and Pointe Coupee (Region 2)

How does this fulfill the program's mission?

The mission of the Capital Area Human Services District (CAHSD) is to deliver caring and responsive services, leading to a better tomorrow.

This program provides clinic and school based mental health and addiction recovery treatment services to youth and adolescents; autism spectrum diagnosis and treatment for children ages 2-7; drug and alcohol prevention education and training to school aged children, and developmental disabilities evaluation, services and supports for individuals up to age 18 who reside within the seven parishes comprising the Capital Area Human Services catchment area.

Who are the principal users?

Children and adolescents under the age of 18 who seek and receive treatment and services from programs operated by Capital Area Human Services Districts.

Who primarily benefits from the service?

Parents, guardians and families of children and adolescents served as well as the individuals directly served.

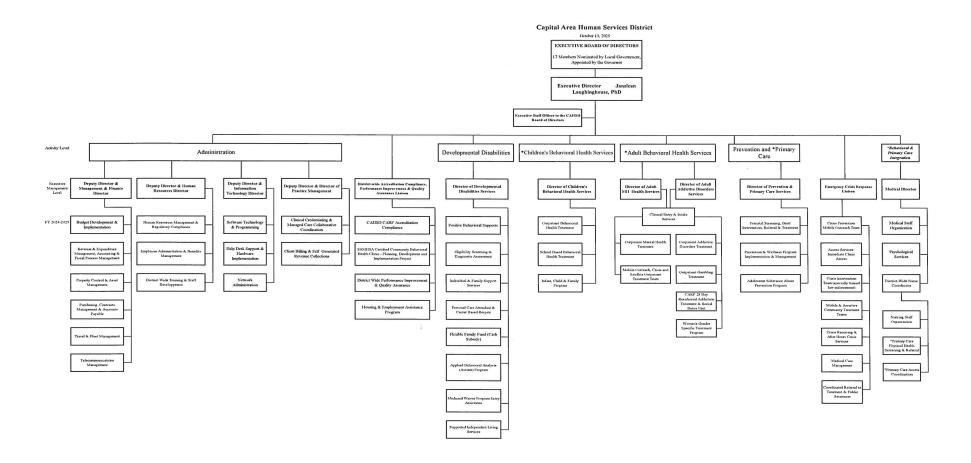
