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Non-Substantial Action Plan Amendment Number 17 (Katrina/Rita 2nd Appropriation):

Reallocation of Long Term Community Recovery Program to Infrastructure Program Delivery Program

Eligible Activity: Section 105 (a)

National Objective: Presumed by activity

Activity Amount: \$842,359

\$700,000,000 (funding in LTCR prior to this Amendment) \$28,850,000 (funding in Infrastructure Program Delivery prior to Amendment). New total = \$29,692,359

This amendment transfers \$842,359 from the *Long Term Community Recovery (LTCR) Program* allocation to the *Infrastructure Program Delivery* allocation. These funds will be used to assist Infrastructure program applicants in developing their projects and complying with CDBG regulations throughout implementation. Funds will be used to provide assistance to applicants in all Disaster Recovery Infrastructure programs, including, but not limited to the following: *Long Term Community Recovery, Fisheries Infrastructure and Assistance, Local Government Emergency Infrastructure* and, including the allocation for *Primary and Secondary Education Infrastructure*.

This transfer is a result of St. John the Baptist project funds being determined as ineligible and therefore available for transfer to remaining needs. This additional funding need was determined as a result of continued consultation with local governments and key partners with stated outstanding assistance requirements related to the number of critical infrastructure projects. This amendment is considered non-substantial since the transfer is less than 15% of the *Long Term Community Recovery Program* allocation and the *Infrastructure Program Delivery* activity; does not create a new program; nor, does it change any beneficiaries.

These expenditures will be presumed to meet the National Objectives of the Infrastructure programs they serve.

Monitoring

This activity is considered to be a low risk activity. Monitoring will be performed by the Office of Community Development (OCD-DRU) staff in accordance with the contracts and the OCD-DRU Monitoring Plan.
