
Narratives

Disaster Damage:

Hurricane Katrina struck Louisiana's coast on August 29, 2005, claiming the lives of 1,464 Louisiana residents. Hurricane Rita followed three weeks later on September 24, 2005. The storms initially evacuated and displaced 1.3 million Louisianans and destroyed more than 200,000 homes, 10 hospitals and 200 square miles of Louisiana marshland. The storms also destroyed 40 schools, damaged 835 schools and flooded more than 16,000 businesses. About 178,000 jobs were lost in the New Orleans area alone. Louisiana was hit with the costliest disaster in US history followed three weeks later by the 3rd costliest disaster resulting in estimated property losses totaling more than \$100 billion.

Recovery Needs:

Coastal Louisiana sees progress and hard work ahead three years after the hurricanes. Estimates are available for the City of New Orleans regarding the impact of Hurricane Katrina on housing occupied by low to moderate income residents which are defined as those below 80% of the average median income (AMI). Those estimates produced by the Greater New Orleans Community Development Center show that 65% of the owner occupied units that are damaged or destroyed belonged to low to moderate income families. Low to moderate income families rented 89% of the rental units that were damaged or destroyed. An estimated total of 119,770 owner occupied and rental units serving the low to moderate income population, or 88.7%, were damaged or destroyed. Recovery will take time, but thanks in large part to federal funding through the CDBG program, progress in South Louisiana is evident. In the New Orleans metropolitan area, some signs of recovery are that roughly 87% of pre-storm populations and 76% of all public and private school enrollments had returned by summer 2008. The population of coastal Louisiana as a whole has rebounded since 2005 with only four parishes other than New Orleans still below their 2005 population estimates. Jefferson and Plaquemines Parishes have both seen major progress with 98% and 95% population recovery respectively, but Cameron and St. Bernard Parishes continue to lag behind other parishes with only 89% and 44% population recovery respectively. The demographics of the Greater New Orleans area continue to shift geographically as families and businesses continue to return or relocate into areas that were less impacted by flooding. St. Tammany Parish, already a rapidly growing Parish before the hurricanes, now has many more households, sales tax revenues, and higher home values than it did before Katrina. The overall progress in the population, economic, and housing recovery has continued to trend in a positive direction, though the pace of all three has slowed and even stagnated this past year. The post-Katrina housing market and over all economy surged for the first two years, but slowed and showed trends of stabilizing in 2007, Despite increased demand for construction labor, the New Orleans metropolitan statistical area is still down over 75,000 jobs from pre-Katrina levels. However, this represents a rebound from the all time low of 178,000 lost jobs. The New Orleans MSA is also still has about 3,000 fewer employers as it did prior to the hurricanes. So far, 2008 has showed less job creation, household rates have increased slowly, and home renovations and demolitions are half of what they were last year, but the trends continue to be positive. As a final point, New Orleans still has many challenges ahead as indicated by other numbers and trends. In the coming years the Crescent City may be straddled with 65,000 blighted or empty properties, quickly rising rents, now 46% higher than pre-Katrina, and wages not able to keep pace. In addition, the labor market for the service and construction sectors remains tight, while public service infrastructure remains thin. With more engaged citizens, businessmen, and government leaders, South Louisiana should be able to complete the hard work necessary to over come many of the challenges that the city faces. New Orleans will be able to build a more robust economy and a better protected city. As we move past year three of our recovery, we anticipate further progress thanks in large part to the resources provided and programs designed through the Community Development Block Grant funding.

Programmatically good progress continues in assisting applicants with compliance:

• Over 100,000 (100,377) or 86% homeowners have become compliant or have provided proof that they have reoccupied their damaged residence. This is a 12% increase from last quarter

• Road Home Final Disposition Metrics indicate 95,540 files have been closed with the program and reached a final disposition. Therefore, 73.5% of Road Home files have a final disposition and considered complete with the Program.

Evidence of Occupancy for Option 1 household is currently 94.2%

There are currently 28,935 homeowners who have entered the monitoring process for compliance with their Road Home Elevation Incentive Grant Agreement. Of this number, 12,285 (42.5%) have provided documentation to the program that their home has been elevated. This number continues to increase (5% increase this quarter) as applicants complete their elevation construction projects leveraging



funds provided though other Parish programs and HMGP.

• At this time there are 16,650 (58%) who have been determined to be non-compliant. Total liability associated with these files is \$484 million.

Most Notable Last Quarter:

Liaison contracts with Franklin and GNOHA have been executed and staff are currently assisting applicants related to compliance documentation and unmet need validation. A week long training was provided to both contractors in May 2015 including policy, process and system knowledge. OCD-DRU provides additional training by sending rotating staff members to each site location on Monday and Thursdays for technical assistance.

• 4 additional office locations were opened in June 2015 allowing applicants to schedule appointments and meet with case workers.

• OCD-DRU has submitted recommendations to HUD regarding solutions to reduce the amount of funds for recovery through policy implementation changes which addresses alternatives to grant calculations and duplication of benefits. These solutions consider some of the applicant's greatest challenges toward compliance and ultimately recovery. Additionally, OCD-DRU has recommended alternate solutions to assist homeowners wanting to still rehab their damaged property. OCD-DRU expects to have approval and begin implementing changes within the program this quarter.

• 150 applicants have used APA 58 to validate an unmet need allowing for variance adjustments totaling 6.7M in grant adjustments

• 61 Homeowners have been assisted with rental and rehabilitation from problems related to contaminated drywall.≈nsp;

Road Home Grant Recovery

As of June 30ththere are a total of 36,561 homeowners in the grant recapture process (overall recapture number less total recapture removal). Of this number, 26,131 homeowners are in the recovery process for at least non-compliance. Compliance is described in the Road Home covenants which were signed by the homeowner prior to receiving federal funding.

• 6,358 (17%) of these recapture files have been removed (\$158 million) for Alternate Recovery Source (ARS). Demands letters are sent to ICF for repayments.

A total of 525 homeowners have returned 14.4 million in elevation funds to the state.

• A total of 1,614 homeowners (only 4.4% of all funded homeowners) have been sent to collections for overpayments. Homeowners currently in the collections process for overpayments owe \$59 million back to the program.

Applicant outreach events are scheduled as needed and upon request in order to assist applicants. This quarter two different Parish outreaches were completed by the Liaison contractors. In addition, it is important to note that homeowners who need special assistance are encourage to contact the program at 1-888-762-3252. Homebound visits are available.

Outcomes of APAs 58-60 (Unmet Needs)

Compliance deadline letters were sent to 55,855 homeowners and another 46,998 grant recovery letters to this population have been mailed. A total of 19,581 homeowners have responded to the grant recovery letters.

2,003 request scenarios for unmet needs have been requested by homeowners. Of this number 1,387 (72%) have indicated that their elevation funds were used for repairs. Other scenarios are as follows:

Activity Description:

The Road Home Homeowner Assistance program provides financial compensation and advisory services will be available for homeowners who wish to select from one of the three following options: 1. Repair/Rebuild - financial incentives to repair or reconstruct on the same site; 2. Sell and Relocate within the state - purchase of the home by the program in exchange for an agreement to resettle in Louisiana; or 3. Sell and Relocate out of the state - voluntary sale of the home with no expectation of resettlement in the state. The allocation for this program represents uses an estimated 55% benefit to low and moderate income citizens. This estimate is based on first and second quarter data which differs from the Road Home registry data. The registry data showed 76.2% of the 107,713 registrants earned at or below \$50,000. Since the registry did not collect data on household size, it is impossible to estimate the number of low income households. This allocation amount and estimated performance will be continually modified as data on the actual applicants is collected. The amount allocated to LMI includes \$8,229,915 of Road Home start up costs that funded program design, the Road Home Registry call center and other start up costs.

Location Description:

The program will serve homeowners in at least 17 permanent and mobile homeowner assistance centers in disaster affected parishes and other areas in and out of state where concentrations of displaced citizens are located.



Activity Progress Narrative:

By the end of the second quarter of 2015, 166,109 applicants from the 229,432 received Road Home applications had been through the first appointment process to discuss disaster grant options. Currently, 130,054 of these applicants have been determined to be eligible for a Road Home grant. 130,245 have been through the closing process, but not all received a grant amount greater than \$0, as of 6/30/2015. Some of the 130,245 were later determined to be ineligible and the funds were returned to the state or the applicant returned the funds on his/her own. No home owners are appealing ineligibility as of 6/30/2015. Of those eligible, 130,037 have been awarded some type of a Road Home grant. Of those awarded a grant amount, none are appealing the award amount as of the end of the 2nd quarter of 2015. The total amount disbursed by the Office of Community Development Disaster Recovery Unit (OCD-DRU) for closings occurring as of 6/30/2015 was \$8,929,598,261.87. The low-to-moderate income families in Louisiana are receiving \$4,831,773,590.43 or 54% of this amount. Activity Description:

The Road Home Homeowner Assistance program provides financial compensation and advisory services will be available for homeowners who wish to select from one of the three following options: 1. Repair/Rebuild ¿ financial incentives to repair or reconstruct on the same site; 2. Sell and Relocate within the state ¿ purchase of the home by the program in exchange for an agreement to resettle in Louisiana; or 3. Sell and Relocate out of the state ¿ voluntary sale of the home with no expectation of resettlement in the state. The allocation for this program represents uses an estimated 55% benefit to low and moderate income citizens. This estimate is based on first and second quarter data which differs from the Road Home registry data. The registry data showed 76.2% of the 107,713 registrants earned at or below \$50,000. Since the registry did not collect data on household size, it is impossible to estimate the number of low income households. This allocation amount and estimated performance will be continually modified as data on the actual applicants is collected. The amount allocated to LMI includes \$8,229,915 of Road Home start up costs that funded program design, the Road Home Registry call center and other start up costs.

Location Description:

The program will serve homeowners in at least 17 permanent and mobile homeowner assistance centers in disaster affected parishes and other areas in and out of state where concentrations of displaced citizens are located.

Activity Progress Narrative:

During the 2nd quarter of 2015, the Louisiana Office of Community Development - Disaster Recovery Unit (OCD/DRU) announced that the Greater New Orleans Housing Alliance (GNOHA) and Franklin Associates have been chosen to provide liaison services to the Road Home program. OCD-DRU has also awarded contracts to Hammerman and Gainer International (HGI) to continue providing primary support services related to the program and to CGI Group, Inc. to provide information technology services.

The liaison agencies will assist Road Home clients who have not yet completed all compliance requirements for their grants. For example, liaison agencies can help grantees identify available paths to return home or, for those already in their homes, the agencies can help gather and submit required information.

This new service complements the work of the Road Home's primary contractor by providing an intermediary for homeowners, as well as a second reviewer of some of the most complicated files.

Franklin Associates will provide services in the Southwest region of the state, as well as working with GNOHA to provide services in the Southeast region. Staff members from both agencies recently took part in a week-long training to learn about Road Home policies and procedures and how to access Road Home data files.

HGI was once again awarded a contract to support the day-to-day administration and implementation of the Road Home program. This includes accounting, reporting, closing of files, case management services, limited legal services, long-term compliance and monitoring, document management, grant recovery and closeout of the program. The company first began work on the Road Home program in 2009.

CGI was again awarded a contract to provide comprehensive IT governance and oversight; application development and maintenance; IT help desk and asset management; and IT infrastructure management.
